MISSION SAN LUIS HOSTS ACROSS GENERATIONS: A FAMILY ART DAY

~ Artist Demonstrations and Art Activities for Families ~

TALLAHASSEE - On Saturday, May 18, 2013, from 10 A.M. to 3 P.M. Mission San Luis is calling all art-loving families to join them for a one-time event. During *Across Generations: A Family Art Day*, visitors will be able to speak with artists, experience demonstrations of various art processes, and participate in hands-on activities.

Across Generations: A Family Art Day is presented in conjunction with the Generations exhibition at the Florida State University Museum of Fine Arts (FSU MoFA), which addresses artistic legacy—the passage of art forms, art methods, and artistic connections from one generation to the next. Across Generations will reinforce the legacy theme by allowing families to explore art together and discover the means through which participating artists learned their skills and developed their styles.

Also on display May 18 through June 1, 2013 in the Mission San Luis Visitor Center will be the *Across Generations K-12 Art Show*. Both Mission San Luis events are included with regular admission to the site. (Adults: \$5, Seniors 65+: \$3, Ages 6-17: \$2. Children under 6, Members, and Active Duty Military: FREE). The FSU MoFA *Generations* exhibit runs May 9- July 12, 2013. MoFA is located at 530 West Call Street, Tallahassee.

Mission San Luis, Florida's Apalachee-Spanish Living History Museum, was the western capital of Spanish Florida from 1656 to 1704. Today the Mission brings the early 1700s to life with living history interpreters in period dress, reconstructed period buildings, exhibits, and archaeological research. The site is managed by the Florida Department of State, Division of Historical Resources, Bureau of Archaeological Research, and support is provided by the Friends of Mission San Luis, Inc. VIVA Florida 500 is a statewide initiative that highlights the 500 years of historic people, places and events in present-day Florida since the arrival of Juan Ponce de León in 1513.
